### A message from our leader

A year has already passed since I was elected President of the Chamber and it's been quite a full year for us.

One of the biggest changes this year has been the amalgamation with the former independent Broadbeach Chamber of Commerce in December.

The motivation behind the move was to provide business operators along this crucial business area a stronger voice with which to champion industry concerns to lobby all levels of government.

Amalgamating these two important entities has provided great opportunities for the strong united Chamber leadership that is required in these challenging times. The long-term financial and social life of the region is at the forefront of initiatives and policies sought as a result of the new amalgamation.

A strong effective Chamber of Commerce along the beachfront continues to ensure that the interests of business operators resonate strongly in future planning and policy initiatives of all levels of government.

I represent our members through a number of avenues with organisations such as the Gold Coast Combined Chamber, Chamber of Commerce and Industry Regional Committee, Heart of the City, Surfers Paradise Alliance, as well as regularly being invited to attend forums with Gold Coast City Council, State and Federal Government to discuss local area issues.

We entered 2009 uncertain about the short term prospects for local, national and international economies. The global financial crisis had the potential to significantly erode local business, investor and consumer confidence but the Coast seems to be weathering the economic downturn better than others.

The Gold Coast continues to enjoy a strong tourism market with flow on effects to most of our businesses and has certainly been encouraging to see that Australia has thus far avoided officially sliding into recession.

It has recently been suggested that the Gold Coast is leading the country out of financial gloom.

#### **Survival Sessions**

In 2009 the Chamber is doing its part to try and help business in these difficult times as well. We have implemented a calendar of boardroom briefings we titled Survival Sessions, offering your business the opportunity to sit down with experts in their field to get advice on matters affecting you, your staff and your business. The sessions are presented by member companies and were free to chamber members and only \$25 for non-members. Any member who feels they have something to offer in a Survival Session can take part and become a host of this continuing series.

#### **New Website**

In the new year we launched our new website as an important Chamber portal. Whilst we still have a lot of information yet to be uploaded – the site is definitely a great facility for people to find out about the Chamber and what we do. With time it will fulfil all our expectations.

Members and guests now have the ability to not only find out what's coming up for the Chamber but also book for functions and events and become members on line.

### **Beach Road Transit Solution**

The Surfers-Broadbeach Chamber of Commerce has been working with Cr Susie Douglas, the Licensed Venue Association, Surfers Paradise Alliance, the Police, Regent Taxis, and Translink to try to develop a solution to the lack of late night transport out of Surfers Paradise. The Transit Centre is seen as the most obvious 'hub', particularly given that it is in the middle of Surfers and currently unused of an evening.

The concept being discussed is for transport options including a secure taxi rank to run out of the Transit Center of a Friday and Saturday evening. Extra security would be put into the area as well as a police presence. We would hope that food would be available and of course there is access to toilet facilities.

To date Cr Douglas has been able to secure funding from the transport levy to start a 'night rider bus'. This will be an opportunity for Translink to come to the table with Council to run a bus east/west late on Friday and Saturday nights. The idea is for the stops in Nerang, Ashmore etc with taxis available to complete the journey home at a much lesser cost than catching a taxi all the way home.

### **Monthly Meetings with Division Councillors**

As part of our drive to provide our members with a strong voice that gets heard, we invite Crs Douglas and Sarroff to our monthly Committee meetings. These meetings have allowed us to identify any areas of importance to our members and the wider community and address them with the people who have the power to do something about resolving any significant issues.

Cr Sarroff has been very generous with his time, as Cr Douglas has always been, since the amalgamation and both Councillors recently showed their support for the Chamber by donating much needed funds to assist us to better serve our members.

### **Surfers Paradise Foreshore Redevelopment**

Surfers Paradise has long been considered one of Australia's most attractive tourist destinations both nationally and internationally. Still, Surfers Paradise currently struggles to cater for growing numbers and significant events due to a lack of public spaces and facilities. With an increasingly competitive tourism market and population growth, it is vital that Surfers Paradise's infrastructure be improved.

Once redeveloped, the foreshore area will be a dynamic, beautiful and functional beachfront that fittingly represents the Surfers Paradise tourist precinct. The redevelopment will make the beachfront a world-class destination enjoyed by residents, day-trippers and overnight visitors.

Surfers-Broadbeach Chamber of Commerce have heavily involved and vocal when representing Surfers Paradise business on this project.

The Juniper Group is ready to start preliminary streetscape works on its component of the foreshore - the area fronting its Soul development on The Esplanade and Council will soon appoint a managing contractor to undertake the remainder of the works in the Foreshore Masterplan area. The managing contractor will establish its on-site presence for the construction program in January 2010.

Whilst traffic problems will no doubt result from these ongoing works, please bear with it as the end result will be superb. The Chamber has been pushing for major construction activity to be delayed until after the holiday and tourist season.

### **Broadbeach Parking**

One of the major issues affecting the Broadbeach and Mermaid precincts would have to be parking. There are very few free parking options left in Broadbeach and with the introduction of 1 hour meters in Surf Parade – the main dining strip for Broadbeach this issue is a key focus for business owners and operators. The problem is even worse at Mermaid since road works began reclaiming many precious parking bays.

I have been very vocal on this matter both to Council and in the media and the Chamber will continue to pursue this matter.

### **Rapid Transit**

The Surfers-Broadbeach Chamber of Commerce has played an integral part in the development of this project. Liaising constantly with Department of Transport and GCCC, facilitating public briefings and voicing your concerns.

This Chamber has long been a supporter of Rapid Transit and its benefits for local business. We were satisfied to see Federal Government funding for Rapid Transit of \$365 million towards this project with a further \$464 million from the State Government on top of GCCC's commitment means the Gold Coast will have improved public transport sooner.

In August the Gold Coast Rapid Transit project team launched an online Local Industry Register to assist local companies to gain work on the project during the construction and commissioning phases.

We are currently working with Rachel Nolan MP's office to secure the Minister for Transport for an upcoming Chamber function to provide more project information and we will continue to provide you with information and opportunities to have your say.

### **Meetings with Broadbeach Alliance**

We are extremely pleased to have Broadbeach Alliance as members, along with a number of their Broadbeach based directors. Their membership allows us to work closely with them, as we do Surfers Paradise Alliance, to forge a better understanding of Broadbeach specific issues and support the precinct with networking functions.

### **Narrowneck Oceanway**

This new stretch of Oceanway will form part of the city's [Oceanway network](#) - 36 kilometres of pathways stretching along beaches from the Gold Coast seaway (The Spit) to the Point Danger Lighthouse (Coolangatta).

Council is committed to improving the city's foreshore and delivering the best possible facilities for residents and visitors. The pathways provide healthy and environmentally-friendly ways for pedestrians and cyclists to explore the renowned beaches of the Gold Coast.

Construction of the staged Council initiative commences late August and is expected to finish mid September 2009. ### **Broadbeach Boulevard Stormwater Upgrade Project**

Works are currently being undertaken to improve local stormwater drainage in the Jubilee Avenue, Surf Parade, Federation Ave, Old Burleigh Road and Queensland Ave areas in Broadbeach. The result of these works will reduce the likelihood of potential flooding.

The project is currently in its second phase of a four phase delivery construction program and it is anticipated that road pavements along Surf Parade and a section of work in Queensland Avenue including the roundabout will be reinstated by 16 September, weather permitting. The construction program is on target with the expected completion of works by early May 2010.

From 18 December during the Christmas holiday period all work will cease and the worksite decommissioned to minimise the impact on local traders, residents and patrons. Work will then recommence on Monday 1 February.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank the Broadbeach traders for their cooperation during these works and ask for their continued patience during this significant and important project.

### **Broadbeach Safety Camera Network**

It is important for Broadbeach business operators to be aware of Council's commitment to enhance public safety, Gold Coast City Council operates a closed circuit television (CCTV) network of 103 cameras within the city's major entertainment districts of Surfers Paradise, Broadbeach, Southport and Coolangatta. There are currently 24 cameras operating in Broadbeach. These are monitored by security operators 24 hours a day, seven days a week. Images are transmitted in "real time" to the Police Communications Centre at Broadbeach and to the Duty Sergeant at the Broadbeach Police Station. Footage captured by all cameras is recorded and retained for approximately 30 days and is provided to Police and other regulatory agencies, upon request.

The Gold Coast Safety Camera Network continues to deliver positive outcomes, as part of a broader safety and security strategy in Broadbeach. CCTV contributes to the improvement of public safety, through the deterrence of opportunistic offences, early detection of incidents, prompt notification of emergency services and provision of evidence to the Police and other agencies such as Liquor Licensing. Between January and July 2009, 1188 incidents were detected by monitoring staff (306 of these in Broadbeach) and 307 tapes of evidence were provided to the Queensland Police Service.

Council believes that its current approach of using CCTV to complement "on the ground" security programs (such as the mall security patrols), is key to delivering better public safety outcomes in Broadbeach. ### **Nikon SuperGP Great for the Gold Coast**

With the Gold Coast's SuperGP motor racing event fast approaching, businesses along our glamour strip are set to reap the financial rewards of this great event. However, thanks to the Bligh Labor Government's poor display of business acumen over the past few months, including last year when we lost the Indy, Gold Coasters have been repeatedly concerned as to whether the event would even go ahead.

In mid-August the rookie Sports Minister informed Parliament that the then-naming sponsor, Nitro, had failed to fulfil its financial commitments to the event and would therefore no longer be sponsoring the SuperGP event. With nearly \$12 million of taxpayers' money being spent on the grand prix and \$60 million to be gained by Gold

Coast businesses, one would expect the State Government and Labor-mate, SuperGP overseer, Terry Mackenroth, to exercise better business proficiency.

In financially difficult times like these, the Gold Coast needs successful events like the Nikon SuperGP to both promote our great city and contribute significantly to the local economy. That is why we cannot underestimate the impact that issues with sponsors and their naming rights can have over the event, as the Bligh Government has complacently done. The Gold Coast needs and deserves this great motor racing event, but we should not be left two months before the event is scheduled to start, wondering whether the race is on or not. The State Labor Government needs to pick up its game and ensure that, in the future, the Nikon SuperGP's major sponsors' financial standings are properly researched so that the event doesn't run into those kinds of funding black holes this Government currently finds itself in.

### **Minister Bagging Surfers is Bad for Business**

I couldn't end this newsletter without addressing Federal Labor Health Minister, Nicola Roxon's, recent attack on Surfers Paradise. There is something uncouth about non-locals or people unfamiliar with our prosperous and envied community singling out Surfers Paradise as a 'problematic', 'binge drinking' centre. While Surfers Paradise has its unwanted by-products of a successful night-life and entertainment hub, it is detrimental to our local businesses and economy to paint it with this

unsavoury brush. As a Federal Minister, Ms Roxon must acknowledge the influence she has over the community and with that in mind should think twice before damaging Surfers Paradise's local businesses with such insulting claims. If the Minister is so concerned about the area, I urge her to speak with her Labor colleagues in the Bligh Government to provide Surfers Paradise with the adequate resources it needs, so that we do not have one of the worst police to population ratios in the State.

MUCH has been said in recent weeks about the economic stimulus package. Should it be continued or, as we are now seeing some green shoots of recovery, should it be wound back?

While some business owners in Surfers Paradise may arguably have got some benefit from the Rudd Labor Government cash splashes, I strongly believe there is no point in continuing to spend like the drunken sailors this Labor Government has been and continues to be.

The tourism-heavy Surfers Paradise, and indeed tourism enterprises of the wider Gold Coast, appear to have come through the worst of the global financial crisis reasonably unscathed. That, though, has been due largely to some sharp, inventive marketing by operators and tourism bodies, not cash splashes.

We are now seeing the first signs of a possible recovery for the local economy, albeit a fragile one. Nationally we've seen some growth in GDP, in job ads and in consumer confidence. While one swallow does not make a summer, it is encouraging and hopefully the portent of better things to come.

That news hasn't gone unnoticed at the Reserve Bank of Australia which is now talking about raising interest rates. The question must then be asked; what is the point of the Labor Government committing Australia to yet more spending which would send the country down the path of higher interest rates and higher taxes?

Since the Budget last year the Labor Government has announced \$106 billion of additional spending. But \$40 billion of that will not even start to be spent until 1<sup>st</sup> of July 2010 and go through to 2013.

At a time when the RBA is considering raising interest rates, how can it possibly make sense for this government to be spending yet more money on so-called economic stimulus which won't start until mid-2010 and go through to 2013 – at a time when it's very likely the Gold Coast economy will probably have an economic recovery under way?

Bear in mind it took the Coalition Government 12 years to repay Labor's \$96 billion of debt, so how long will it take this nation to repay Labor's \$315 billion worth of debt?

The interest bill on that debt which you, the accommodation providers, the restaurateurs, the gift shop owners of Surfers Paradise will have to pay, will be at least \$9 billion for each and every year we carry that debt.

Labor has consistently said that fiscal policy and monetary policy must work together. With the RBA looking to increase interest rates, the worst thing would be for the government to keep spending billions of dollars as stimulus which will only make the problem worse.

The economic stimulus might be great now while the party is going and everyone's having a great time, but the hangover is coming. A \$315 billion hangover, and it's going to be here before you know it. For you, the small business owner, that's going to mean higher interest rates and taxes.

**Statement by David Goodwin, CCIQ Director**

Today's decision by the Queensland Industrial Relations Commission to increase wages by \$16.20 and allowances by 2.5% is regarded as extraordinary given the state of the Queensland economy.

The majority of the evidence continues to show that Queensland is experiencing a serious economic downturn that has and will continue to impact on all Queensland employees, especially low paid workers.

Given the current fragile nature of the Queensland economy the wage increase handed down by the Commission is unreasonable and will create significant hardship for many businesses.

CCIQ's position was that there should be no wage increases granted for the 2009-10. Quite simply the Queensland economy and businesses are not in a position to absorb any wage increase.

Queensland businesses are experiencing severe financial difficulties with a number of businesses already laying off staff or considering further reducing staff numbers. Our State's unemployment rate has already climbed to 5.8%.

2009 should be a year where we do everything possible to ensure that employees in all industries, especially those on the lowest pay rates (traditionally award employees) retain their employment.

93% of Queensland business affected by this decision have indicated that they will reduce their employments levels as a result of a \$16.20 increase.

In the current economic environment jobs are more important than a wage increase. In our view, if it was choice of a job or a wage increase, the majority of employees that will be affected by this adjustment would elect to keep their job.

It was not unreasonable to freeze wages for the next year in a measure to protect jobs.

Granting a wage increase in the current economic environment will result in further job loses and less incentive for employers to recruit new employees.

CCIQ believes that Unions and the Commission have a responsibility to not just those in employment and their members but also the unemployed. The prospect of these disadvantaged Queenslanders finding work is now reduced.
